Noted Photographer Speaks at Brooklyn Library

Lorraine Salem Tufts, an internationally-recognized author and wildlife photographer, will speak at the Brooklyn Branch of the Cuyahoga County Public Library (4480 Ridge Rd., 398-4600) from 2:30 to 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 16th. Ms. Tufts is the author of the book, *Secrets in Yellowstone and Grand Teton National Parks*, which received critical acclaim in both the soft-cover edition published in 1988 and the hard-cover edition released in 1990. Winner of two national awards, the book has been recognized by the state of Wyoming, the National Geographic Society, and Eastman Kodak Company, which assisted her second effort.

The main focus of her photography has been mammals and large birds, primarily from the Northern Rockies, desert Southwest, and Southern Florida. Ms. Tufts (a 1965 graduate of Brooklyn High School) has hiked, taken river trips, and photographed from helicopter, Grand Canyon, Zion and Bryce Canyon National Parks. Her discourse, augmented with slides, will show how she shot her award-winning photographs.
